ARTIST SPOTLIGHT: Elizabeth (Lizz) Tucker

1. You recently earned an MFA that included travel to Italy. Tell us a bit more about this particular option, why Italy?

The program I graduated from, with a Masters in Studio Art, is based in Florence, Italy. It was heaven to be there, as expected. My first two summers were on the East coast at one of Florence Academy of Art's (FAA) satellite campuses. The last summer of the program required us to be in Florence. Being surrounded by extraordinary art and architecture really supported all that I was focusing on at FAA. I had been in Florence before when it was less crowded and cooler in temperatures, but anytime in Florence is a gift.

2. You showed us at the last art share, a painting completed using a limited palette. Was this one of the requirements of the exercise?

I have always used a limited palette in my art training and art work. Limited palettes allow for unity and color harmony in the painting without sacrificing color or value structure. Limited palettes are also very easy to handle as you only have to ask basic questions of Lighter/Darker, Warmer/Cooler, and more or less chromatic. For my painting I used a Zorn

palette, named for the Swedish painter Anders Zorn, who did a self-portrait showing his palette of colors, white, yellow ochre, cad red light/vermillion, and black. This is a primary palette where black acts as the lowest chroma of blue. It is a low chroma color palette used as part of training in most ateliers, and has a huge range of potential. I don't remember if this palette was required but it worked for what I was painting.

3. The painting was a still life of a teapot a and an empty plastic bottle. What other possibilities did you consider and why did you pick this one?

I could have chosen anything, but I knew I had to bring my still life objects with me. These were small so it would fit in my carry-on, and I have painted the Moroccan copper teapot many times. I love the form and mixed metals of copper and brass. My thesis was about the contradiction of throw-away plastic despite them lasting hundreds of years, and the antique tea pot that would last equally as long. Could we see the same beauty and find value in the plastic bottle as in the teapot? To read my thesis statement click here.
