AWA has recently completed a research project to update our statistics on women artists. In 2017, an average of 4% of artworks in U.S. museum collections were created by women—a stark reminder of the long history of limited access to training, exhibition space, and institutional support for women in the arts. American Women Artists set out to change that. Today, thanks to the efforts of artists, advocates, and institutions like **you** and AWA, that number has begun to rise. Today, 13% of works in U.S. art museums are by women, a sign of real progress—though much work remains. Let's keep rolling up our sleeves and making an impact.

I have been a member of WomenPaintersWest since 1994 I was President from 1999-2001 and again in 2013-2015.

I started my art career by entering as many juried art shows as I could, and in time, I have managed to be in many solo and invitational exhibitions throughout Los Angeles and southwestern United States.

My art derives from travel, especially places in California and the Southwest. This exposure to nature led me to several years of painting landscape with pastels. The first image on left, "Twelve Thousand Feet & Climbing', represents the type of work I did for several years.

With travel suddenly unavailable to me, I took up painting nature landscapes from inside my head. These other two images represent what I do now. Using pastel paper on hand, I began painting with many mediums including pastel, allowing myself the all-important "happy accidents", and additionally, looking for ways to indicate something of nature.
